

A stone spear point (9.6 cm) and two war arrowheads (bone, 21 cm, and ivory, 24 cm)



For similar spear points, see Leskov and Müller-Beck (1993, #135-145). The arrowheads were specially designed to pierce an armor plate, and were not used for hunting. For a very similar but smaller (~12 cm) example of the bone arrowhead, see Arutiunov and Sergeev (1975, Fig. 66-7, Ekven burial 56, "arrowhead"), and for other arrowheads of the 24 cm type with a triangular cross-section, see Geist and Rainey (1936, Plate 21-9) and Collins (1937, Plate 34-7).
